





Animal Watch Craft!

- **Step 1** Draw an animal that would be awake at the given time for each square on the time strip.
- Step 2 Color your watch.
- **Step 3** Cut out the watch and time strip.
- **Step 4** Cut along the dotted lines on the watch face. Folding the watch face can make this easier.
- **Step 5** Tape the watch together, large enough that it can slip on and off of your hand.
- **Step 6** Feed each end of the time strip through the face of the watch. The ends should be on the inside of the watch band.
- **Step 7** Glue the ends of the time strip together.



You can change the time on your watch by pinching it between your fingers and sliding!
