Rio Grande Valley of Texas—The Mecca of Birding Nov 15-20, 2025



Join GCBO's Board President Mike Williams and Executive Director Martin Hagne for a subtropical birding extravaganza to one of the most bio diverse locations north of Mexico... the Rio Grande Valley of Texas! This is a true birding mecca, and we will spend 4 ½ days exploring many of the hotspots.

Tour Description:

The RGV is located in the middle between east and west of the US, a major fly going through it, it borders the sub-tropics to the south, and temperate to the north, it has 12 biotic community within 4 counties, and 4 major habitat layers from the river and north. This creates a rich biodiversity rarely found elsewhere. Well over 500 bird species have been recorded here! That is more than all states except for 3 or 4. There are many species found only here within the US... so a must place to bird.

We will chase Green Jays, Great Kiskadees, Black-crested Titmice, Gray Hawks, White-tipped Doves, Olive Sparrows, Harris's Hawk, Green Kingfishers, Ringed Kingfishers, Hook-billed Kite, Aplomado Falcons, Morelet's Seedeaters... and so much more!

To get as many bird species as possible on our trip, we will explore many of these areas and habitats. We will do quite a bit of traveling across the valley, especially east to west, to be able to accomplish this. Martin lived in the RGV for over 30 years, and heavily birded all of its fascinating locations. He also enjoys exploring the food scene... so be prepared to eat "local"!

We enjoy being based out of the same hotel for the whole trip, and we will ride in a 12 passenger van.
